The Ahmadiyya Muslim Community brings message of peace to Liverpool

A seminar on the topic of *“Teachings of the Holy Qur’an and Global Peace”*, organised by the Liverpool branch of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Association UK, was held at the Heatherlow Community Centre in Walton, Liverpool, on Sunday 15 May 2011. The seminar was part of a series of events organised by the Association across United Kingdom to create awareness about the peaceful teachings of Islam. Mr Abdul Momin Zahid, a young scholar of Islam and lecturer at the Ahmadiyya Theological Institute in UK delivered the keynote speech on the topic. The audience was introduced to the worldwide Ahmadiyya Muslim Community by playing a documentary describing amongst other things the wide range of humanitarian services delivered by the Community across the world. The comments of a number of UK parliamentarians and politicians about the Community and its services to mankind in the documentary were an eye opener for many in the audience. A panel of scholars answered a range of questions about the teachings of Islam especially in relation to the contemporary issues and problems. While enjoying a finger buffet at the end of the programme, the visitors spent quite some time speaking to the visiting scholars and members of the local community and viewing an exhibition on the tenets of Islam and its peaceful teachings. Amongst the participants were local councillors, administrators, members of the Merseyside police and men and women from different other walks of life. Through various discourses in the seminar, the participants appreciated how the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community practices and preaches the Community’s logo – Love for All, hatred for None.
